

LIVING WITH VOLCANOES

THE MAGNETISM OF MT. FUJI & IZU OSHIMA 6 days



Active-volcano island Oshima is the northernmost of the Izu Islands, dotted from north to south in the Pacific, 100 kms south of Tokyo, whose 8,000 residents have an unusual view of life with a volcano as a neighbour. Our 3-days on the island will allow us to gain a deep understanding of the environment, life-style & heritage which leads islanders to enjoy the prospect of an eruption.

Atami, conversely, is one of Japan's great onsen (hot-spring) resorts, with a totally different yet in its own way equally distinctive culture built around that role. And, just a few minutes north, lies the famous Fuji-Hakone National & Geopark, through which Japan's most storied Trail-Road, the Tokaido runs during its 500-km journey from ancient capital Kyoto to modern capital Tokyo, established by one of the great figures of Japanese history, the first Shogun, Tokugawa Ieyasu. Walking on the Tokaido, parts of which remain unchanged from 400 years ago, and visiting other elements of Ieyasu's legacy in Shizuoka, allow us to step back in history, all the while surrounded by the landmarks of millions of years of seismicity in this, one of the global focal-points of seismicity.

Highlights:

Oshima island enjoys a unique climate, subject as it is to Pacific winds. However, its temperatures closely reflect those of Tokyo, while less prone to unpleasantly high humidity thanks to those winds. Daytime temperatures are likely to be in the low 20s in June, September & October, the high 20s in July & August, while rainfall also peaks in June, July and October, but is usually sporadic, rather than constant. Evening temperatures are generally 10 degrees below daytime. Temperatures in Atami are similar to those on Oshima, while those in the Hakone geopark can be up to 5 degrees lower, due to its altitude. In clothing terms, tees/polo-shirts with a good sunblock are generally appropriate, though from June thru September long-sleeved shirts are recommended for cycling or walking, as the sun can be strong & shade is not always accessible. Summer & autumn is typhoon season in Japan, and while not as frequent in this area as in Japan's south-west islands Okinawa & Kyushu, we will take all necessary measures in communication and preparation to ensure your safety should one approach.

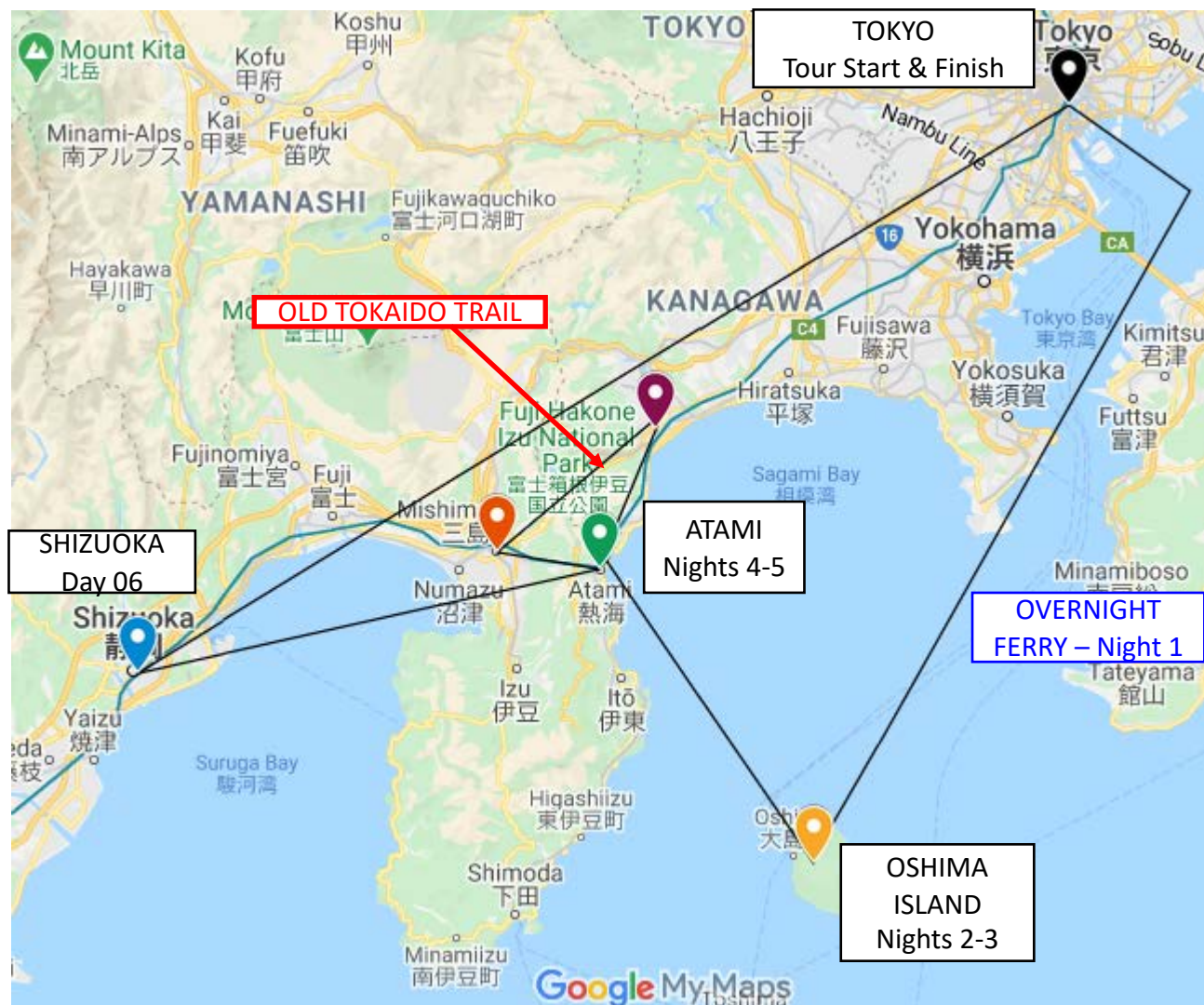

Day-by-day Itinerary

Day 1 – Gather for Dinner near Takeshiba Pier – Overnight Ferry to Oshima

Before heading off to discover the Geoparks surrounding Tokyo, gather at 20h00 in the lobby of the Hotel Azur, in Takeshiba, cenral Tokyo, overlooking Tokyo Bay, where Yumiko, our tour guide will welcome all of the group.

Dinner is just a short walk from the hotel, in a restaurant overlooking the waterfront, and during the meal, Yumiko will run through the tour schedule, briefing everyone on details and the highlights ahead, as well as providing information and hints to help with final preparations for the adventure ahead. After dinner, we'll head straight back to the pier to check-in for the overnight ferry journey to Oshima.

Cabins on the boat include two separate beds, shower, wash-basin & toilet facilities, and offer the chance for a good night's rest as our ferry ventures from Tokyo Bay into the Pacific Ocean immediately south, and on to Oshima.

Day 2 – Arrival in Oshima – Panoramic Island Tour – Volcano Museum Visit

Arrival at Oshima is early at 06h00, and from the pier on the island's west coast, we'll head south to our hotel for a hearty Oshima breakfast, and a chance to freshen-up (rooms won't be available until the afternoon). Having found our feet on the island,, we'll head off on a morning tour of the island, starting in the south at the charming harbor village of Habu, heading north along the east coast of the island to learn of the island's intrinsic relationship with camellias from the Director of its most famous Gardens, and returning to Motomachi Port, where our ferry arrived earlier, for lunch.

After lunch, visit the Volcano Museum, recognized as one of the best of its type, and focusing particularly on the most recent major eruptions of Mount Mihara in 1950 & 1986. From there, head south along the coast to view the famous Open-Strata rockfaces, detailing tens of thousands of years of geo-history, before checking-in at the hotel for a rest before a barbecue dinner featuring local produce, washed down by local micro-brews or wine, & perhaps a chance to enjoy Oshima's night sky.

Day 3 – Oshima’s unique Geoscape - Hiking Mt. Mihara Volcano & Japan’s only Desert

Today, get to know the unique environment of Oshima. An island of less than 100 sqkm, with a population of just over 8,000, centred on the active volcano of Mt Mihara. Hike across the slopes of the mountain, and enjoy the opportunity to not only see, but touch the geological scars left by historical eruptions, most notably those in 1950 and 1986, both of which resulted in the island being evacuated, but only after the inhabitants had spent significant time not only watching, but actually enjoying what many of them consider to be the honour of an eruption during their lifetime. After walking the crater-mouth, venture into Japan’s only Desert, a vast swathe of Mt. Mihara whose vegetation was wiped-out by the 1950 eruption. Later, enjoy lunch at the onsen ryokan high on the slopes of Mt Mihara, & an opportunity to relax muscles taxed by this morning’s hike in the natural hot-spring baths, some with view directly onto Mt. Mihara. Return to the hotel before heading out to dinner with an opportunity to casually interact with some of our islander hosts.

Day 4 – Discover Oshima’s unique Culture, and the hot-spring resort of Atami

Your last day on Oshima is a chance to experience and understand the culture that has developed on this volcanic island, 20 kms off the mainland coast. Choose either to join a morning fishing trip, or combine an experience making Camelia-Oil from the flowers seeds, with a visit to a local shrine.

Fishing is Oshima’s premier industry, and the waters around the island remain rich in marine resources, thanks to centuries of balanced interaction with the sea.

Join a local fisherman on his daily trip into the local fishing grounds, and stop in at the fish-market on your return to port. Camelia-oil is another product closely associated with Oshima, and while mass-production is now mechanized, there are still local companies producing oil by traditional methods. After a lunch of fresh sushi, Oshima-style, you’ll head back to the port where you arrived, to take a jetfoil westwards across the Pacific to the hot-spring resort of Atami, where your hotel is just a 10-minute walk from the port (luggage will be handled separately).

After checking-in & freshening-up, head out for a stroll thru one of Japan’s premier hot-spring resort towns, before a dinner featuring local produce, accompanied by local micro-brews, wines & juices.

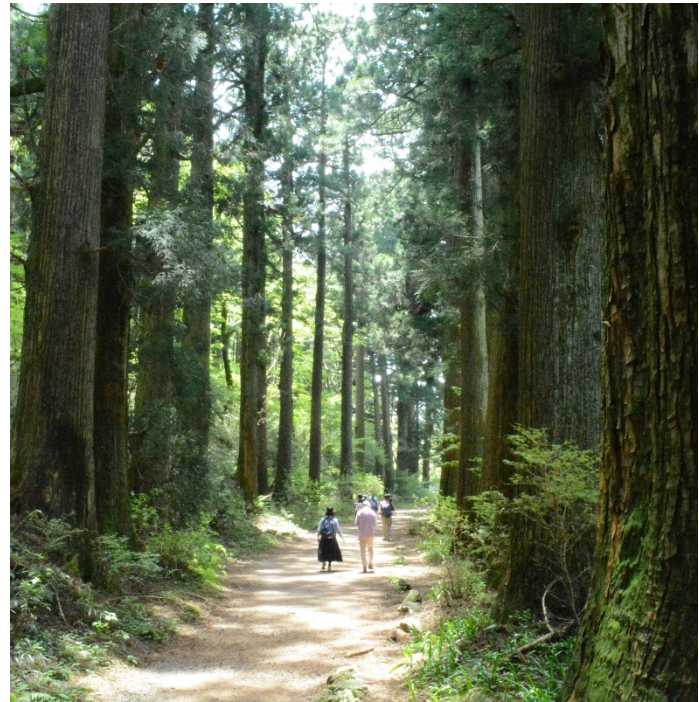

Day 5 – Hike Hakone Hachiri! The fabled Tokaido Road, thru the foothills of Mt. Fuji

Today, we will minimize our footprint by relying totally on our own feet, with a some assistance from public transport! This is an opportunity to walk on Japan's most-storied historical road, in the National Park in the South-Eastern foothills of Mount Fuji. After breakfast, walk to Atami Station, take a Bullet Train to Odawara, and a local train & bus combo into the Fuji-Hakone National Park. After a traditional Japanese energy charge at the charming historic tea-house 'Amazake Chaya', specializing in Amazake, a sweet drink made from sake-mash. We'll embark on our hike along 'Hakone Hachiri' first descending to Lake Ashi, the deepest, and arguably most picturesque of the five lakes surrounding Mount Fuji. After passing thru Hakone's famous Cedar Avenue, lined with towering 400-year-old cedars, and a lunch stop, we'll continue along some cobbled parts of the historic road to Yamanaka Castle Ruins, and the very modern Mishima Skywalk, before taking a local bus into Mishima, where after short visits to the park where Mt. Fuji's famous spring water surfaces, and Mishima Shrine, we'll take a Bullet train back to Atami. Dinner is a traditional Japanese full-course kaiseki meal, with the option of tasting some local sake.

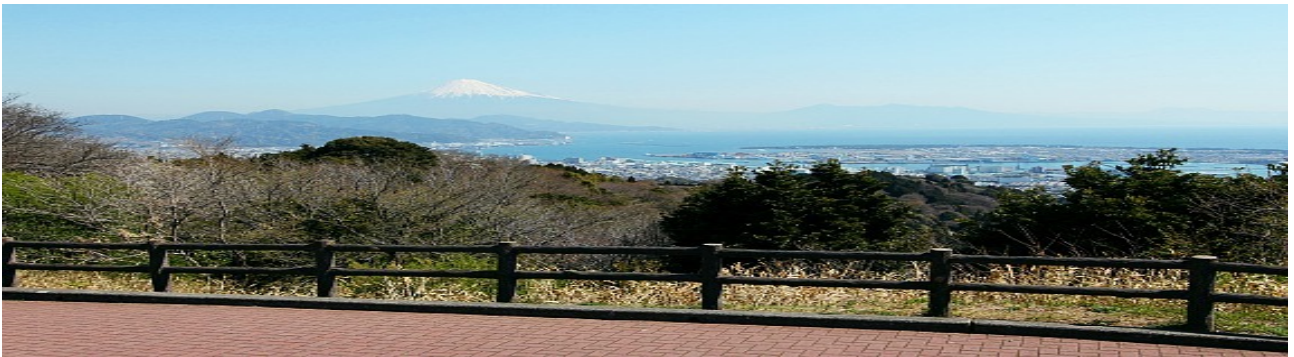

Day 6 – Dive into the world of the First Shogun, make some sushi & back to Tokyo

Suitcases safely forwarded to Tokyo on the previous evening, it's time to check-out this morning, and embark on the last day of our tour, walking to Atami Station to take a Bullet Train 30 minutes west to Shizuoka, the city where Japan's first Shogun, and one of the country's historical heroes, Tokugawa Ieyasu, built the power base from which he ultimately assumed political leadership of the country. On arrival, we'll head to the rarely visited but stunning and fascinating Kunozan Toshogu Shrine, originally built as the burial site for Ieyasu, whose grave was ultimately moved to the more famous Toshogu in Nikko. A short cable car ride from here is Nihondaira, famed throughout Japan as offering the best panorama of Mount Fuji, so fingers crossed the skies are clear! Then, back into the city centre for a sushi-making experience, sushi-lunch and even Sushi-Museum visit, showing just how fundamental the culture of sushi is to coastal cities like Shizuoka.

Then, return to Shizuoka Station for a one hour Bullet Train ride back eastwards to Tokyo Station, where the tour ends by 17h00.

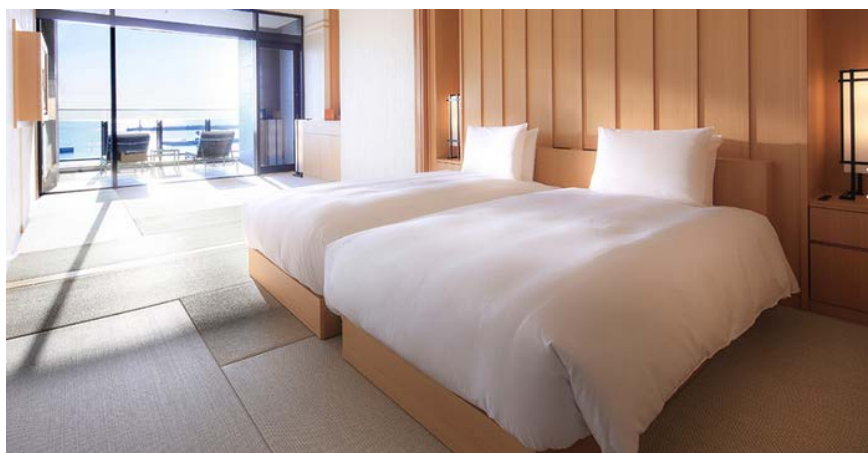
